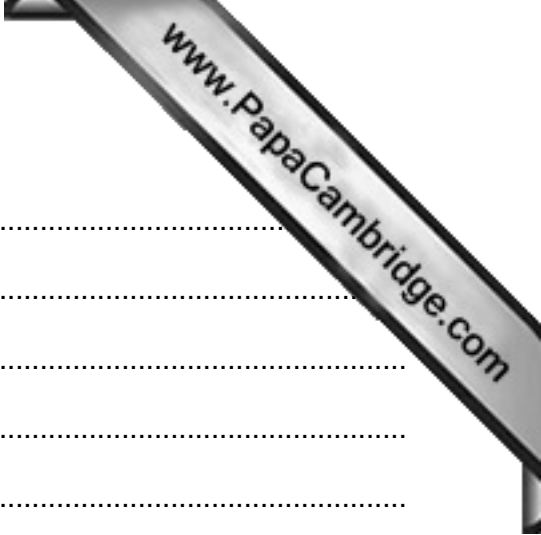

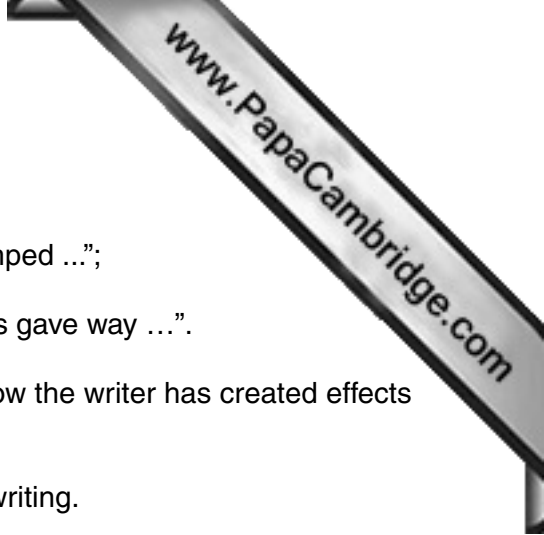

Up to 10 points are available for the content of your answer.

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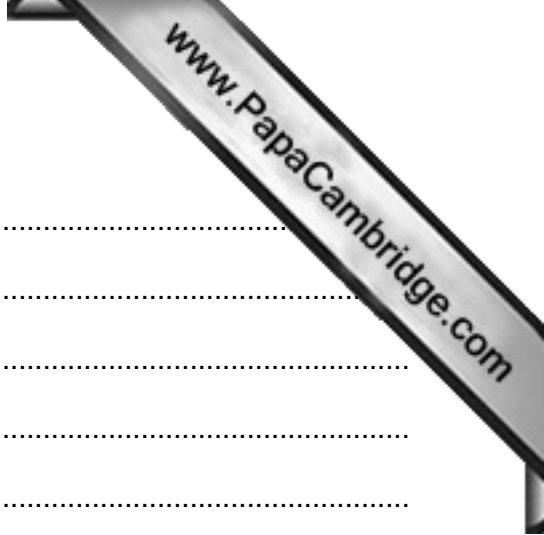
3. Summarize:

Up to 15 points are available for the content of your answer, and up to 5 points for the quality of your writing.

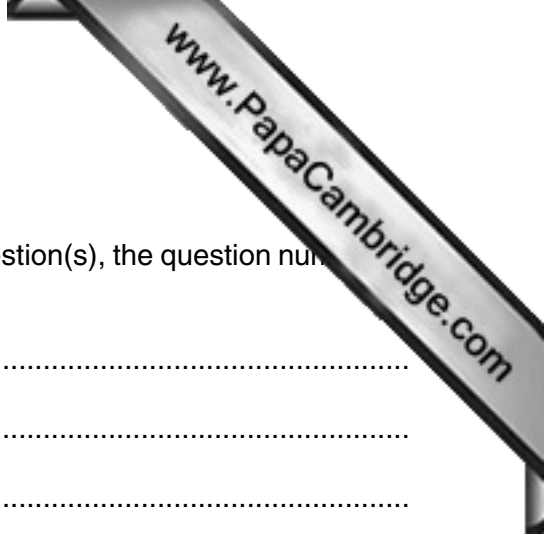

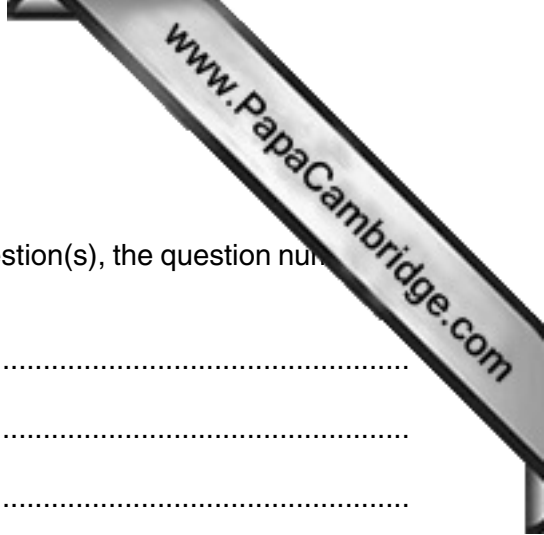
