1	Some appropriate usage to reward. Where verbs are not in an appropriate tense award a maximum of 1 mark. Some errors do impede communication.
0	No examples of appropriate usage to reward. NB 0 marks for Language means none for communication either.

10 marks are awarded for Communication; 5 marks for Accuracy, in line with the banded mark scheme below.

Communication

Each of the 3 tasks (a), (b) and (c) and one of either (d) or (e) must be completed to get 10 communication marks.

If any of the above is missing, the maximum communication mark is 9

If 2 of the above are missing the maximum communication mark is 8

Possible points candidates could make under the bullet points set out in the question:

- Introduce themselves (name, age, siblings, school, etc.);
- Say where they live (town, country, type of household, etc.);
- Say they are environmentally friendly and mention examples of things they do (separating rubbish, recycling, going by bike/ on foot, etc.);
- Refer to problems that may arise from climate change (higher temperatures, changes in the weather, polar ice melting, air pollution, illness, lack of water, etc.);
- Say what could be done to improve the situation (working together, giving out information, planting more trees, using more public transport, using less energy, etc.).

Mark Scheme for Accuracy

5	Limited range of vocabulary, idiom and structures (e.g. <i>weil, als, wenn, kein</i>). The style of writing is basic but reasonably coherent. Use of a limited range of verbs, often successful. More accuracy than inaccuracy.
4	Basic range of vocabulary, idiom and structures (e.g. <i>weil, kein</i>). Sentences may be repetitive (e.g. all beginning with <i>ich</i>), but are often successful. Use of a basic range of verbs, with some success. The writing is sufficiently accurate for meaning to be conveyed.
3	Basic range of vocabulary and structures. Sentences are repetitive (e.g. all beginning with <i>ich</i>). Some awareness of verb usage. Despite regular errors, the writing conveys some meaning.
2	Basic vocabulary and structures. Effective for a variety of straightforward messages. Little awareness of verb usage. The degree of inaccuracy often obscures the meaning.
1	Minimal vocabulary. Effective for some messages (more than one), usually unconnected. Insufficient accuracy to convey the meaning.
0	Insufficient accuracy to be awarded a mark of 1.
