

  - (c) And when this letter has been read among you, have it read also in the church of the Laodiceans; and see that you read also the letter from Laodicea. (Colossians 4:16)
  - (d) For it was not to angels that God subjected the world to come, of which we are speaking. (Hebrews 2:5)
  - (e) For every high priest is appointed to offer gifts and sacrifices; hence it is necessary for this priest also to have something to offer. (Hebrews 8:3)
  - (f) Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us ... (Hebrews 12:1)
